Recycling is Easier than Ever!

These items can be co-mingled in any recycling bin:



Cans

Aluminum beverage cans and steel and tin food cans. Please rinse the can and remove the lid or push it into the can. No need to remove labels. **NO FOIL OR FOOD TRAYS, PLEASE!**



Glass

Food and beverage containers such as jars and bottles only! Clear, green or brown glass. Remove lids and rinse. Leave labels on. No light bulbs, mirrors, window glass, etc. Cans and glass may be mixed together in the same recycling container.



Plastics #1-#7

Only plastic numbered #1 thru #7 food and beverage and detergent containers only. The number is on the bottom of the bottle. Most soda, milk, and water bottles fit this category.



Mixed Paper and Cardboard

Newspapers, magazines, office paper, and phone books less than an inch and a half thick must be tied in bundles or bagged with paper grocery bags and placed at the curb.



Bulk Item Collection

Bulk item collection is limited to one item per household per week. Examples of bulk items are: sofas, appliances, furniture, mattress and box spring, etc. Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners and dehumidifiers contain Freon (CFCs) that by law must be removed before they can be disposed. You must have the freon removed and have a certified sticker before calling for removal. You must have the Freon removed by a refrigeration mechanic and a certification sticker must be put on before putting the item out for collection. Most appliance dealers and repair shops can do this. Many dealers will remove your old refrigerator when they deliver a new one.

Hazle Township Garbage and Recycling Information

Hazle Township is separated into 5 Collection Zones

Garbage and Recycling are collected on the same collection day depending on where you live in Hazle Township, refer to the zone map at right for which day. There is also a list of streets that show how the zones are separated. Each household is limited to six bags of household refuse per collection day. We start garbage and recycling collection at 6 am, so it is better to get your garbage to the curb the night before, but no earlier than 6 pm. Use plastic or metal trash cans or plastic trash bags. All Garbage should be bagged, please do not put out garbage in paper bags, cardboard boxes, or containers smaller than 20 gallons. **THESE CAUSE LITTER!**

Holidays: If your collection day falls on a Holiday collection will resume on the next collection day, or one day late. Holidays: New Year's Day (January 1), Memorial Day, Independence Day (July 4), Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day (December 25).

How to Dispose of Batteries

NiCad, NiMH and Li-Ion batteries should be recycled. Be environmentally conscious - do NOT throw these batteries in the trash. If you don't know where your local recycling facility is, call the Portable Rechargeable Battery Association at 1-800-822-8837. They will provide you with the address of the recycling center nearest to you.

Electronic Waste Recycling (E-Waste)

E-WASTE: is considered hazardous waste and should not be placed curbside. Check the Township's website for drop off locations at <http://www.hazletownship.com> for different E-cycling events held throughout the year.

Disposal of Household Paints

Latex paint: Let paint dry in can. Adding kitty litter or a commercial drying agent will speed up the drying process. When paint is dry, double bag the can before putting it in the trash. Leaking paint will damage our trucks and stain your street.

Oil based paint is hazardous waste. Call Luzerne County's Solid Waste Management Department at 800-821-7654 or 570-820-6300.


Leaf & Yard Waste Collection

Tree branches cannot exceed three inches in diameter. Yard waste will be collected on the same days as garbage and recyclables. Place yard waste in bags or garbage cans. Lawn clippings and weeds are collected with garbage.

No Home Construction or Demolition Debris!

If you're putting on a new roof or remodeling your house, you need to make special arrangements with us or another waste hauler to remove the debris.
